




Oliver sees the sign light up that says it is safe to cross the street. Safety Pups know to still stop, look, listen, and wait for help from a grown-up before crossing the street.

Oliver sees tools on the bench. They look cool, but tools are for grown-ups. If it builds or fixes —safety pups don't touch!




Someone is knocking on the door. Oliver doesn't know them, so he doesn't go near the door. Safety Pups never open the door for someone they don't know. Find a grown-up.


Oliver smells smoke. He knows to move away and tell a grown-up right away. If you smell smoke or see fire — get help fast.






